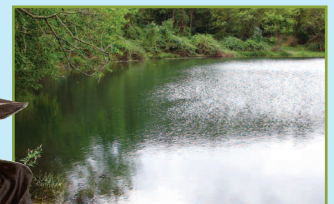

UMT Park System Expands Again With Independent Park and Apple Park

Upper Macungie Township has once again expanded its park offerings for the enjoyment of our citizens. Independent Park is just off of Route 863 with a unique 9-hole Par 3 golf course. The course is admittedly not Pebble Beach but it is a lot of fun, free and provides tremendous vistas of our surrounding countryside.

UMT is in the process of improving the areas surrounding the Ponds at Apple Park. Three of the five ponds are in UMT and walking paths are in place. The largest of the ponds (Pond #1) affords a peaceful view and harbors large-mouth bass. UMT is also considering re-stocking the ponds with other species. These ponds have the potential of becoming a favorite “fishing hole” for anglers.

Your Township Supervisors encourage all UMT families to explore these wonderful new greenspaces this Fall.

Directions to Independent Park: From the UMT Township Building on Schantz Road, proceed west to SR 863 north. Turn right and the park is circa 1/4 mile on your left. (Signage is in place.)

Directions to Apple Park: From the Fogelsville Hotel, turn right (north) on Church Street and proceed circa 1 mile. Turn right on Packhouse Road. Turn right on Apple Road and the tennis court and ball field is on your left. If you continue on Packhouse Road without making a right turn, the Apple Park Ponds parking area is approximately 1/8 mile on your left.

Illegal Sump Pump Removal Deadline is Here

Camera Surveys Underway – Environmental Violators Face Hefty Fines

Sump pumps connected to the Upper Macungie Township sanitary sewer system are illegal and will be tracked down within the coming months. Violators will face heavy fines.

The discharge from these illegal sump pumps takes up valuable capacity at the Allentown Treatment Plant, driving up sewer rates for all property owners and challenging systems that work to keep environmental water clean.

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and Upper Macungie Township are serious about tracking down property owners who still have sump pumps connected to the sanitary sewer system.

Our Township sump pump law is necessary to protect the general population’s water quality and economy from abuse by the few who still discharge water illegally. If you have a sump pump connected to the Upper Macungie Township sanitary sewer system, remove it now. You are in violation of an important law which will be enforced to protect our water resources.

Here in Upper Macungie Township, the Lehigh County Authority now has a team inspecting pipelines for illegal sump pump drain connections. These inspections are being conducted with cameras designed to operate inside the pipelines. Property owners with illegal sump pumps will be subjected to heavy fines.

The township is proud of our recreational facilities of which there are currently ten parks which are operational (Route 100, Breinigsville, Ricky, Lone Lane, Apple, Blue Barn, Independent, Grange, Fogelsville Pond and Church Street)... not only do these locales provide athletic fields, but include pavilions, disc golf, tennis, volleyball, basketball, a “pitch and putt” 9-hole golf course and fishing. Locations are on the UMT



website (www.uppermac.org) and are available in a brochure at the Township Building. New signs have been installed at Independent Park and at the Ponds at Apple Park. Apple Park includes a playing field, tennis court and ponds.



Plans are in place to build a deck at Pond #1 which would provide a platform for those anglers among us. UMT has also reinstated a Recreation Board to advise the township as to future recreational needs. The new pole building on Route 100 will house storage for parks maintenance equipment and improved restroom facilities. Buffer plantings are on hold due to



Route 100. RFPs (request for proposals) have been approved by the Board of Supervisors to establish a Main Station on Grim Road to accommodate our Berks-Lehigh Regional Police. Route 100 north of Fogelsville is being widened.



There will be a new signalized intersection at Glenlivet Drive and Route 100.

A new detention basin is being dug to serve development on the west side of Route 100. The new completion date for the Route 100 and Penn Drive



improvements is November 23, 2009. We are planning to finish the intersection and all of the improvements south to Schantz Road. The sign structure will not be completed until December 21, 2009. It appears that the completion of the final paving north of Penn Drive will not be done until Spring 2010 due to the Sign Structure work.

The UMT Board of Supervisors extend their heartfelt thanks to all who contributed to Community Day on September 19, it was a tremendous success! Enjoy another glorious Autumn in Upper Macungie Township!



For your convenience, Upper Macungie Township provides property owners with the means to properly dispose of their leaves and yard wastes. There will be a one-time only, curbside pickup of YARD WASTE on October 7. After that, yard wastes may be deposited at the UMT Yard Waste Drop-off Site. Information on both disposal choices are detailed below. The next pickup will be scheduled for Spring 2010.

October 7 Curbside Collection for YARD WASTE

This is a one-time, township-wide pick-up day for Fall clean-up. Facts are as follows:

WHEN: Wednesday, October 7, 2009

WHAT:

Leaves from trees, bushes and other plants, shrubbery clippings and tree trimmings.

(See maximum size, detailed below in "How to Prepare")

WHAT NOT:

No grass clippings, roots from trees or shrubs or lumber. Improper bags, bundles or materials will go uncollected and tagged to notify residents of reasons why materials were not accepted.

HOW TO PREPARE:

Yard wastes placed in commercially-designed **open trash containers** (with sloped sides) no larger than 32-gallon capacity with a loaded weight of less than 60 lbs. each. Smaller limbs and branches **must be tied and properly bundled** to a **maximum size of 48" x 18" x 18" with a maximum weight of 60 lbs.** If branches and limbs are not tied and bundled, they will not be picked up. Ties for bundles must be made of biodegradable materials.

All containers must be out the night before after 6 p.m.

HOW MUCH:

Combined maximum of 6 containers will be collected.

services the contract to handle refuse and recycling collection in Upper Macungie Township. **Refuse and recycling pickup is on a weekly basis.** New residents: you must come into the township building to fill out a moving permit. You will then be informed when your trash cart will be delivered (for new construction only), which zone you are in for trash pickup, and what day your pickup will be.

ALL COMPLAINTS OR MISSED PICKUPS SHOULD BE DIRECTED TO RARITAN VALLEY DISPOSAL AT 610-432-7574.

MATERIALS TO BE RECYCLED IN UPPER MACUNGIE TOWNSHIP:

- Newspaper (**Tied** or in **paper bag**)
- Residential mixed paper
- Glass (clear, green, & brown)
- Aluminum, tin and steel/bi-metallic cans
- **All Plastics:** soda bottles, laundry detergent containers, milk and water jugs, ketchup, mustard, etc. will be accepted (from 1 to 7 with a recyclable symbol, rinsed and cleaned out.)
- Corrugated cardboard



CARDBOARD RECYCLING CONTAINER

Upper Macungie Township has a container for recycling **CARDBOARD** and it is for **UMT RESIDENTS ONLY.**

This recycling container is in the UMT municipal building parking lot. All boxes must be flattened and cut down into 2 ft. x 4 ft. pieces.



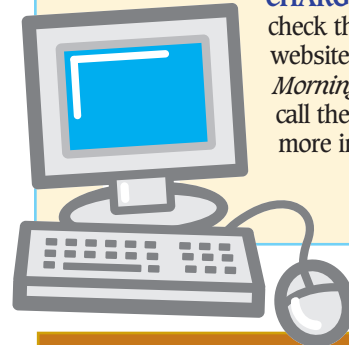
This does **NOT** eliminate cardboard recycling at the curbside. It is for the times when it rains or you have a lot of cardboard. You can bring it to UMT and put it into the recycling container.

The drop-off site will be open Monday to Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.

ELECTRONIC RECYCLING EVENT

Electronic recycling event will be held on October 17, 2009 from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. We will accept computers, monitors, printers, faxes, copiers and stereo equipment, **BUT NOT APPLIANCES OR TVs.** There is **NO**

CHARGE. You can check the UMT website, *The Morning Call* or call the office for more information.



SENIOR CITIZEN DISCOUNT

The Township is offering a \$30.00 senior citizen discount for trash and recycling for anyone over 65 with proof of age (e.g. driver's license or passport). A senior must be 65 years of age by December 31, 2009 to be eligible for the discount in 2010. Also, you must own and live at your residence. If you are 65 or turn 65 between now and December 31, please come to the township municipal building to **apply and register for senior citizen discount for 2010 by December 31, 2009.**

2009 Leaf Collection Schedule



The Upper Macungie Township Department of Public Works will begin its 2009 Leaf Collection Program on **Monday, October 12** and continue through **Friday, November 27**. The crews will cover the entire Township three times. Due to the rate of maturity of trees within the township, and also the fact that more trees are planted every year, it is impossible to guarantee a set pickup day for a specific street in any area of the Township.

All residents in the Township should place their leaves along the edge of the road, not on the road, **prior to the start of pickup at 7 a.m. on Monday** of each week. Leaves will normally be picked up between the hours of 7 a.m. and 3 p.m., Monday through Friday. Leaves will not be collected on private property. If leaves are not in place when the crews go by, they will be picked up on the following round through the Township.

No return trips will be made to pick them up.

Do not place pieces of wood, steel, rocks or concrete on the leaves to hold them down. These objects will cause extensive damage to the leaf pickup units and put them out of service at a great expense of time and money to the Township and its citizens.

To pick up leaves by mechanical means, it is necessary to dump the contents of plastic bags or other containers into the gutter area. Crews will not empty bags or other containers; this is the responsibility of the resident. Branches, shrubbery, garbage, and building materials will not be picked up. These items will be left behind and it will be the responsibility of the resident for removal and disposal.

To facilitate the picking up of the leaves, please keep all vehicles away from the area where the leaves are piled. The crews will not rake piles of leaves out from between parked cars or from under them.

UMT SNOW REMOVAL: RULES & REGULATIONS 5

Like police and fire protection, snow removal on Upper Macungie's 130 miles of roads is a service that can be critical to the health and safety of Township citizens. Our crews work around the clock to keep your streets safe. In an effort to continually improve Township snow removal service, the Public Works Department wants you to know more about our efforts and to answer your most frequently asked questions about snow removal.

When does snow removal begin?

When the Road Department receives word from the forecasting service that a storm is on the way, the crews begin preparation so that they may be on the streets as soon as possible. Township crews start by spreading salt on the streets. When approximately 3" of snow has accumulated, the crews will begin to plow the streets.

When will my street be plowed?

Depending on the severity of the snowstorm, residential streets are usually plowed in this order: arterial and collector roads will be plowed first; secondary roads and cul-de-sacs will be plowed after main roads have been cleared within 18 hours after the storm ends. Of course, a blizzard could cause the time period to be longer.

Will my cul-de-sac be plowed?

Cul-de-sacs will be plowed with the other residential streets. Due to the circular design of these streets, it is often difficult to equally distribute the snow along the curb line. Do not become alarmed if one area of the cul-de-sac has more snow after plowing than another.

Should we move our cars from the street?

When a storm is forecasted, move vehicles to off-street parking when possible and keep vehicles off the street until after plowing is completed. Parked cars can be both a hazard and hindrance to snow removal efforts. This allows plows to clear the entire roadway the first time through, making return trips unnecessary.

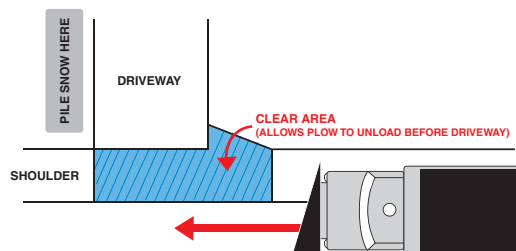
How wide of a path will plows clean?

If possible, the plows will clean your street curb to curb. However, this is not always possible because of parked cars on the street. When cars are parked on the streets, the crews will try to remove as much snow as possible.

What about driveways and sidewalks?

When cleaning your street, the crews have no place to push the snow except to the curb, this creates the unavoidable problem of already cleaned sidewalks and driveways being covered with snow. The best solution to avoid this situation is to wait until the streets have

been cleared before cleaning driveways and sidewalks. Remember: do NOT shovel snow from driveways into roadways. This practice is illegal under the state motor vehicle code and is also hazardous. **The Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code provides for a maximum fine of \$300.00 for this violation. Property owners are reminded that they are responsible for the actions of anyone they hire for snow removal.** The accompanying diagram shows how to clear snow from your property. If cleared properly, the plow's blade has a chance to "unload" its build up of snow passing your driveway.



What if my mailbox becomes covered with snow?

Your mailbox and the access to it for the U.S. Postal Service is the responsibility of the resident. Again, because the crews have no place to put the snow, curbside mailboxes may become blocked. Heavy snow coming off the plows may damage mailboxes. This is not intentional, but does occasionally happen. Please make sure your mailbox is sturdy and in good repair. The Township will not be responsible for repairs/replacements to mailboxes, fences or shrubs placed within the legally defined rights-of-ways of its road. The homeowner is responsible for replacing/repairing a mailbox damaged by plowed snow, **unless they are actually struck by the snow removal vehicle.** If this has occurred, please go to the Township office and fill out a complaint form. This is the only way that the Township will address this issue.

My lawn or landscaping was damaged by a snowplow, what should I do?

As with any objects that are placed within the legal road right of way by the property owner, the Township will not be responsible for correction or replacement if so damaged during the course of snow removal. The individual property owner is responsible for marking their lawn edge with a reflective-type stake or marker.

Upper Macungie Township's snow removal operators are human, and during a storm they work long hours trying to do their best for the benefit of all. Please do not abuse them or the Berks-Lehigh Regional Police may be contacted.

IF DISASTER STRIKES...

UMT's C.E.R.T. Citizen Volunteers Trained in Emergency Preparedness

If our community was struck by a sweeping disaster—natural or manmade—how would you react to protect your family and property? Tough question. And most Lehigh Valley residents do not have a ready answer for it. But disasters do happen. And if this world is suddenly turned upside down by a cataclysm such as a terrorist attack or devastating weather event, a newly formed team of Upper Macungie volunteers will be ready.

The Community Emergency Response Team (C.E.R.T.) is a group of Township citizens being trained by local fire, police, EMS and Lehigh County Emergency Management experts in ways to respond to disasters in our community. Team Leader MaryEllen (Mel) Shiels got the local C.E.R.T. initiative rolling in her Applewood neighborhood and there are currently 15 active members on the squad.

“There is no substitute for the expertise of first responders like police, fire and EMS professionals. But the fact is, in a widespread disaster, they would have their hands full taking care of hundreds, maybe thousands, of people. There is no assurance that they would be able to get to you promptly. So what measures must you take to survive until they arrive?” she explained. “C.E.R.T. is all about having a disaster preparedness plan in place so neighbors can help neighbors protect each others’ health, families and property until that professional help arrives.”



NEIGHBORS HELPING NEIGHBORS: UMT's C.E.R.T. volunteers stayed busy sharing emergency preparedness information at Community Day 2009.

At the core of the national C.E.R.T. training regimen is educating community members how to prepare with the techniques, tools and resources enabling self-sufficiency for a minimum of three days. “The goal is to take care of ourselves and do the greatest good for the largest number of people threatened by a disaster, minimizing loss of life and property damage. That also means having

food, water, safety needs and communication for at least 72 hours,” Shiels said.

She hearkens back to the relatively recent history of the Hurricane Katrina disaster in New Orleans. “It took days and days for rescue teams to get to some of those

folks. Chaos broke out. Lots of lives were lost that could have been saved if the proper emergency response training had been in place to empower neighbors to help neighbors.”

The Applewood unit is the first C.E.R.T. group in Upper Macungie but interest has been expressed about starting similar units throughout the Township. Carbon Monoxide “The Silent Killer”

- Carbon monoxide is an odorless, tasteless, colorless gas responsible for an average of 1500 accidental deaths each year.
- Carbon Monoxide detectors are now available at local stores. Every home should have at least one!
 - If your detector goes off, call the 911 immediately! It is not a false alarm and could help prevent a tragedy!
 - When your detector activates, it will sound a steady beep—not to be confused with the short chirp it will make when the batteries are low.



Time to Check Detector Batteries!

Check your smoke and carbon monoxide detector batteries! They should be replaced semi-annually. Your detectors should be checked weekly to ensure they are operating properly. They can't save your life if they don't work!



NIXLE: The Time is NOW!

Upper Macungie Township continues to be one of the safest places to live in the Lehigh Valley, thanks in part to Chief Michael Weiser and the Berks-Lehigh Regional Police Department. Now 30 officers strong, BLRPD continues to strive to provide professional and courteous service to the community, and is proud of its reputation for being one of the most well-equipped, well-trained departments in the area. BLRPD also oversees the Township's 18 Crime Watches and a Business Watch program.

Recently, the department announced a new way that the department would communicate crime information with crime watchers and residents.

Nixle is a web-based program that allows Chief Weiser and Crime Watch Coordinator Officer Peter Nickischer the ability to disseminate crime base information (such as robberies, burglaries, and assaults) immediately to its residents, by way of email alerts and text messages. Anyone who is an Upper Macungie resident may subscribe to the service for free at www.nixle.com.

It will take less than 2 minutes to register your email and cell phone number with the service. There are no worries with this system, because it is safe and does not send junk email or advertisements. Once registered, users will receive accurate and prompt information directly from the police about crimes and other serious incidents, such as child abductions or major traffic accidents. Remember, these alerts are Upper Macungie specific so if it's going on in this Township, you will be the first to know!
