ORDINANCE # 2012-07
(Duly Adopted December 6, 2012)

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER MACUNGIE, LEHIGH COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 15 (MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC), PART 2 (TRAFFIC REGULATIONS) OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER MACUNGIE AMENDING NO TRUCK TRAFFIC ON CERTAIN STREETS LOCATED WITHIN UPPER MACUNGIE TOWNSHIP; SAID REQUIREMENTS BEING SET FORTH MORE FULLY IN THE BODY OF THIS ORDINANCE.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Upper Macungie, Lehigh County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1. ADDITIONS, INSERTIONS AND CHANGES

The following section or part thereof denoted in the section number is added, with such addition being denoted by the word "NEW" preceding the additions.

SECTION 2. BODY OF ORDINANCE

Section 15-207. No Truck Traffic on Certain Streets. [Ord. 2004-4, 3/4/2004, § 2]

Section 15-207(3) Prohibition of trucks on certain roadways.

A. Based on engineering and traffic studies performed by the Township and pursuant to Title 75, § 4902(b), the Township hereby prohibits truck traffic from traveling on the following roadways:

Street	Restricted Area
"NEW" Oldt Road	Between Adams Road and Wood Lane
"NEW" Wood Lane	Between Adams Road and Township line
"NEW" Arrowhead Lane	Between Schantz Road and Wood Lane
"NEW" Weiss Road	Between Ziegels Church Road and Wood Lane

SECTION 3.

It is declared that the enactment of the Ordinance is necessary for the protection, benefit and preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the Township.

SECTION 4.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith shall be and the same expressly are repealed.

SECTION 5.

This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon adoption by the Board of Supervisors.

SECTION 6.


